Like a Tree


How Trees, Women, and Tree People Can Save the Planet **Jean Shinoda Bolen**



The loss of a huge and beautiful Monterey Pine that was cut down in her neighborhood is the inspiration for best-selling author/activist Jean Bolen's latest book, Like a Tree: How Trees, Women, and Tree People Can Save the Planet (Conari Press, April 2011).


The tree came down while Bolen was at the United Nations in New York, attending the annual Commission on the Status of Women





"As I went deeper and deeper into the subject of trees, I entered a complex and diverse forest of knowledge, from archeological to mystical," writes Bolen. "I learned that we wouldn't be here at all—we, the mammals and the humans on this planet—if not for trees. I learned that reforestation was the difference between cultures that stayed in place and thrived, and those that cut down the trees and did not: these are very applicable object lessons for humanity now."

Like a Tree is also a call to save women and girls, who, like trees, are survivors of worldwide oppression. "Women and girls are a resource," says Bolen. "Educate a girl and she will marry later, have fewer, healthier children, and almost all her earnings will benefit her family. A convincing case can be made that participation by women is the key missing element in finding solutions for the financial, environmental and military problems that underlie the instability of our world. Valuing girls is like valuing trees. It's good for them and for the planet." She reports on the organizations working to

stop the violence against women, from Amnesty International and UN Women, to Betty Makoni's Girl Child Network in Zimbabwe.

In **Like A Tree**, Bolen offers a unique vision based on metaphysics, psychology, mythology, and global gender politics. She writes eloquently about deforestation, global warming, overpopulation, and gendercide, as well as about her own work to establish a UN 5th World Conference on Women.
